



Questions:

I was wondering with all the many complaints about speeding vehicles reported have there been any plans to review the streets to ensure they all have the adequate number of speed limits signs and the appropriate signs on the streets that have multiple speed limits. Main street for one has 3 signs total as you drive from Rt. 16 to Rt. 66 there is one 35 mph sign at Main and Edgerton then as you drive from Rt. 66 South to Rt. 16 there is a 25mph sign on the right then there is a 35mph sign just prior to Niles St. So this means the north bound side of Main St. is 35mph and the South bound lane is 25mph until you reach Niles Street then it becomes 35mph.

Answer:

Speed limit signs are regulated by the Department of Transportation and the Local Traffic Authority. The Town cannot arbitrarily place additional, reduce or modify speed limit signs. The process to request additional or changes to speed limit signs includes significant traffic studies. Currently, the Town does not have sufficient funding to do a town wide traffic study to determine the appropriateness of speed limit signs.
